Lapostolle's goal is as simple as it is ambitious: to create world-class wines using French winemaking philosophy and Apalta's superb terroir. Shaping the vineyard vine by vine, they produce some of the finest wines in Chile.





CUVÉE ALEXANDRE CABERNET SAUVIGNON

Named to honor the family's legacy of fine wines and spirits dating back to 1827, the red wines of Cuvée Alexandre are produced entirely from Apalta estate grapes. The flagship of the line, Cuvée Alexandre Cabernet Sauvignon is a global benchmark of quality for the variety.





CLOS APALTA

Clos Apalta is a powerful, complex Carmenère blend with tremendous aging potential. Recognized in the Top 3 wines of the Wine Spectator Top 100 three times within five years, Clos Apalta established a new level of international prestige for the top wines of Chile.





At age 37, Isidora Cousiño single-handedly fulfilled her late husband's dream of owning and operating a premier Chilean winery. After more than 150 years, Cousiño Macul is the only Chilean winery established during the 19th century that still belongs entirely to the founding family.



ISADORA SAUVIGNON GRIS

Isadora was a leading figure and major philanthropist in Chilean society during the late nineteenth century. Her legacy is honored through Cousiño-Macul's Sauvignon Gris. This rich and refreshing wine has notes of stone fruit, citrus, pineapple, and chamomile.



FINIS TERRAE

Cousiño Macul's vines are ungrafted and come from massal selections from their own nursery. Finis Terrae is a clear reflection of the Maipo Valley's terroir expressed through the finest of Cousiño's Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot from each vintage.

TerraNoble's wines represent the ultimate in varietal expression, and they produce modern wines that exemplify the unique characteristics of each varietal. CA1 and CA2 represent and showcase Carmenere by accentuating the influence of the Andes Mountains and Pacific Ocean, respectively.



CA1 ANDES

Grown in the warm Andes foothills of the Colchagua valley, CA1 is a Carmenere of great character and power. The round tannins and intense aromas of ripe red fruit reveal the best expression of Carmenere grown at the foot of the Andes Mountains.



CA2 COSTA

Grown in the cool coastal mountain range of the Colchagua Valley, CA2 offers refreshing elegance, soft textures, and intense dark fruit and spice flavors. This vibrant wine shows the perfect exv pression of Carmenere's varietal character from Chile's Costa zone.

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Chile is an ideal viticultural landscape: the Atacama Desert to the North, the Andes Mountains to the East, the Patagonian ice fields to the South, and the Pacific Ocean along the West Coast isolated Chile from phylloxera for centuries and preserved ancient genetic stock of ungrafted vines.

Combined with diverse topography, a wide array of soils, and the natural cooling influence of the Humboldt current, Chile provides the perfect environment for sustainable farming and world-class wines.

COMPLEX TERROIR

Chile's DOs are delineated north to south, around transverse river valleys that run from the Andes to the Pacific. However, within each DO there are three distinct climactic zones running East-West that further define the terroir: the Coastal Mountain Range, the Andes foothills, and between them the Entre Cordilleras.
